Science

We will begin our first unit on information processing and living things. We will explore and investigate different plants outside as an inquiry activity. Then we will discuss plant reproduction and the parts of a flower.

Language Arts

We will begin Adventures in Language IV A. We will start off reviewing subject and predicate and the parts of a narrative writing.

Social Studies

Our main focus in 4th grade is Nebraska history. We will start by discussing the state flag, seal, motto, and symbols. Then will learn about the basics of history.

Reading

Miss Christensen: We will begin reading this week on Wednesday the 21st. We will read the story 'The Doughnuts' this week in class focusing on character traits and new vocabulary terms. Some terms we will cover include: chauffeur, chute, pinochle, and skeptical..

Mrs. Timm: We will begin reading class this week on Wednesday and start with a new story called Ron's Summer Vacation. Ron has a very big imagination and we will see where it takes him and the adventures he goes on. Vocabulary: vacation, kayak, rapids, expecting, sober, budge, bounding. Mrs. Mever: We will be reading Who Stole the Wizard of Oz? by Avi. The mystery revolves around a rare edition of The Wizard of Oz missing from the local library. When Becky is accused of stealing it, she and her twin brother Toby set out to catch the real thief and prove her innocence. Vocab: impatient, valuable, concluded, insisted, tilting, muck, converted, banister, pursued, companion. Mrs. Hiebner: We will be finishing a program that this group started last year. Since I have the same group, we will review the start of a multiple-lesson story called Old Salt, the Retired Sailor. Vocabulary: Ashamed, compass, magnifying, code.
