Commencement Ceremony

The district shall conduct a commencement ceremony for members of the senior class at the end of the school year. Participation in the ceremony is a privilege, not a right, and the superintendent or his/her designee may prohibit students who have violated conduct rules from participating in the ceremony as a consequence for the misconduct.

Students who are regularly enrolled as members of the senior class and have met graduation requirements for a diploma and complete other administrative requirements or conditions may be permitted to participate in the commencement ceremony. Students with individual education plans who receive modified/adapted curriculum or full-time special education services may participate in the commencement ceremony. A student may participate in only one ceremony. Being permitted to participate in the ceremony does not constitute graduation, and only those students who have completed all graduation requirements will receive a diploma. The Principal may make allowances for students to participate in commencement exercises at his/her discretion.
