## CENTRAL CITY INVITED TO JOIN THE LOU PLATTE CONFERENCE

As the 2015-2016 School Year came to a close, Central City Public Schools received an invitation from Lou Platte Conference officials, officially asking Central City to join the Lou Platte Conference for the 2017-2018 School Year. Major college conference changes of recent years have trickled down to the high school ranks, as declining enrollment, logistics, and constantly changing demographics have changed the landscape of Nebraska. The State of Nebraska has seen multiple schools change conferences in recent years, and many more changes will be made in the near future.

The Central Conference will already see changes for the upcoming school year with the departure of Fairbury to the Southern Conference and the addition of Adams Central to replace Fairbury. The Central Conference currently consists of Grand Island Northwest, Crete, Schuyler, Seward, York, Aurora, Holdrege, Columbus Lakeview, Adams Central, and Central City. Only Central City, Adams Central, and Columbus Lakeview are consistently classified by the NSAA, as Class C, with the other members of the conference classified as Class B.

Central City had previously involved themselves in discussions with the Lou Platte Conference, but at that time, the Lou Platte was not looking to expand. Adams Central has left the Lou Platte for the 16-17 School Year and Kearney Catholic will be leaving the conference at the conclusion of the 17-18 School Year. The Lou Platte is made up of Class C-1/C-2 schools including: Ord, St. Paul, Gibbon, Wood River, Ravenna, Centura, Doniphan-Trumbull, and Loup City-Arcadia. Amherst has also received an invitation along with Central City to join the conference.

Conference decisions sometimes lead to difficult discussions in regards to school size, competition, logistics, pride, and tradition. These are all important aspects to consider when considering conference alignment. The Central City district must balance tradition and pride of being a long-time member of the Central Conference with taking a real look at current student numbers and the ability to put students in competitive, successful scenarios.

Central City's 16-17 student enrollment will be the lowest that will be seen in many years to come and the NSAA number of 135 will place football in Class C-2 (typically C-1) and track in Class C (typically B). In future years, the district's NSAA number will increase into the 160s and with continued growth, the district's NSAA number will continue to increase, but will still be well below the next smallest school in the Central Conference. While competing in the Central Conference and competing against schools two and three times larger, Central City has not seen a conference championship since the 2013 wrestling conference championship and the girls have not won a conference championship since the girls golf team won in 2011.
